Justice of the Supreme Court of Lithuania

Member of the Judicial Council of the Republic of Lithuania

Dalia Vasarienė is a Justice of the Civil Division at the Supreme Court of Lithuania. She has started her career as a judge in 2012 at the Court of Appeal of Lithuania, and soon after, in 2013, was appointed to the Supreme Court by the members of the Parliament of the Republic of Lithuania.

In 2020 Ms. Vasarienė was elected by her peers to represent them at the Judicial Council of the Republic of Lithuania. In the framework of the Judicial Council, she acts as a coordinator of the Committee for Judicial training and international relations. The focus of the activities of this Committee is rests on developing a vision of initial and continuous training for judges, organizing domestic and international seminars, coordinating cooperation with international societies uniting judges as well as representing the Judicial Council in various international and EU networks and working parties.

Ms. Dalia Vasarienė is also an active member of the academic society. Having received her Master of Laws degree from the School of Law of Mykolas Romeris University (Vilnius, Lithuania) in 1998, she earned her Ph.D. in commercial law in 2002. Since then, she has been a lecturer at the School of Law at Mykolas Romeris University, her area of academic interests focusing on property law issues. Ms. Vasarienė has held a position of a vice- dean at the School of Law in 2007-2011; she is an author and co-author of a number of publications, several textbooks and manuals in civil law dedicated to property law, constitutional issues related to the right to conduct business and other. Ms. Vasarienė also acts as a member of Ph.D. theses' defence committees in the School of Law of Mykolas Romeris and Vilnius Universities. Until 2020, she worked as a lecturer for notaries public, bailiffs, and other legal professionals.

In addition, Ms. Dalia Vasarienė is an elected member of the Notary Examination Commission and a trained court mediator.
