# Data CCBE-ENCJ Survey

on the Perception of the Independence of Judges among Lawyers

2017



In co-operation with the CCBE

The Executive Board of the ENCJ asked the CCBE, the Council of Bars and Law Societies of Europe to disseminate a survey among lawyers on the independence of judges. The CCBE sent the survey to its members and asked them to disseminate it on the national level.

The reply rate was good in some countries, but bad to non-existent in many other countries. In this overview replies are shown for countries with a rate above 0,5% of the total number of lawyers (CEPEJ data).

When interpreting the data the reply rate must be taken into account.


