THE VENUES

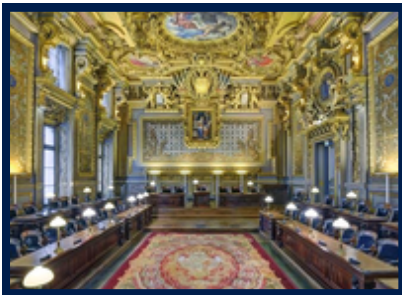
GENERAL ASSEMBLY VENUE

The Assembly will take place at the Court of cassation.

Created in 1790 under the name "Tribunal de Cassation", the highest court in the judicial system was renamed "Cour" by Bonaparte in 1804.

The 19th century provided the supreme court with a setting worthy of its mission. Architecture, sculptures, paintings... everything reminds visitors of the crucial role played by the Court in our society : to ensure a uniform interpretation of the law.

Located at **5 Quai de l'Horloge on the Île de la Cité**, the Court of Cassation occupies the north-west wing of the Paris Law Courts. There will be signs posted at the entrance to guide you.



GRAND'CHAMBER

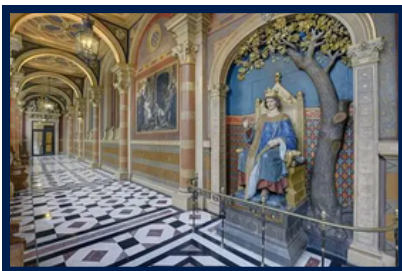
3rd and 4th june 2026

Designed by architect Coquart, the Grand Chamber was inaugurated in 1892. At the four corners of the courtroom, the great jurist sovereigns (Justinian, Charlemagne, Saint Louis, and Bonaparte) watch over the Grand Chamber, which has resonated with the rhythms of history, just as it did in 1906, when the Court exonerated Captain Dreyfus there.

CRIMINAL CHAMBER

5th june 2026

The Criminal chamber rules on disputes concerning crimes, offences, contraventions, criminal proceedings, enforcement of sentences... Through a surprising play of reflections, the iridescent tones of the stained glass windows in the Saint-Louis gallery strike the bays of the criminal chamber, thus superimposing themselves on a richly decorated ceiling.



THE SAINT LOUIS GALLERY

In the 13th century, Saint Louis removed justice from the only judgement of God. Justice, rendered by man, became fallible and required the institution of a control mechanism to ensure the proper application of the law : this became the mission of the Council of Parties, an offshoot of the King's Council, whose successor is the Court of Cassation.

COCKTAIL RECEPTION

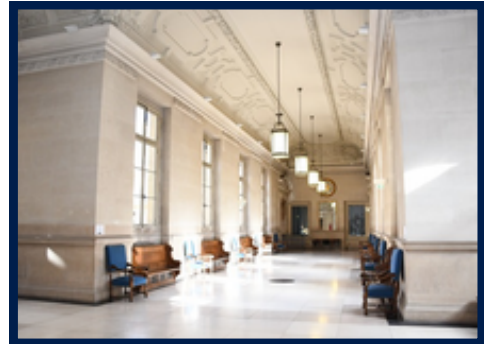

Paris Court of Appeal - Justitia Gallery

You will enjoy a standing cocktail reception with cold hors d'oeuvres. You will have the opportunity to taste French champagne and sample specialities.

The Justitia Gallery is the former nave (1776) of the chapel of the Cour des Aydes (a court of law under the Ancien Régime).

It houses a gilded statue entitled "La Magistrature" by Denis Puech. It stands on the site of the choir of the former chapel of the Cour des Aydes, at the far end of the Justitia Gallery.



GOURMET DINNER

Thursday 4th June 2026 - 8:00 pm

Le Procope - 6th arrondissement

In 1686, Francesco Procopio dei Coltelli, a gentleman from Palermo, opened his bar on Rue des Fossés Saint Germain (now Rue de l'Ancienne Comédie). The excellence of the drinks and sorbets, the pleasant setting, and the neighborhood meant that his establishment quickly became a meeting place for intellectuals.



The first Parisian literary café was born, and for more than two centuries, the worlds of literature, art, and politics frequented Café Procope such as Voltaire, Robespierre, Molière, Diderot, and Benjamin Franklin.

You will enjoy a gourmet menu including a starter, main course, and dessert.

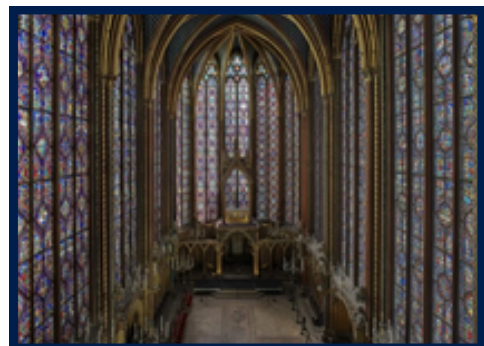
VISIT OF THE COURT OF CASSATION

(2:30pm) **AND THE SAINTE-CHAPELLE**

(4:00pm)

Friday 5th June 2026 - 5 Quai de l'Horloge

A precious remnant of the royal palace of the Cité, the Sainte-Chapelle was built in the mid-13th century by Louis IX, the future Saint Louis, to house the most prestigious relics of the Passion of Christ : the Crown of Thorns and a fragment of the True Cross.



TRANSPORTATION

FROM/TO ROISSY CHARLES DE GAULLE AIRPORT



TAXIS

By taxi and depending on traffic, it takes between **35 and 60 minutes** to travel from Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport to central Paris.

From the airport, there are fixed rates to the capital: **€56 to Paris Rive Droite and €65 to Paris Rive Gauche**. Official taxis can only be found at stations located at the terminal exits and are recognizable by their illuminated **“TAXI”** sign.

It is possible to book a taxi in advance to avoid waiting and to get a vehicle suited to your needs.



ROISSYBUS

The Roissybus is a direct bus line connecting the airport to the heart of Paris, with a single terminus at Opéra (Scribe stop). The bus serves the three main terminals : Terminal 1, Terminal 2, and Terminal 3 (Roissypôle bus station). The ticket price is **€14 per trip**.

Buses run on an extended schedule, from approximately 5:15 a.m. to 12:30 a.m. They run frequently, around **every 15 to 20 minutes during the day**.

The journey time between Paris Opéra and CDG is **approximately 60 minutes**, depending on traffic conditions.



RER B

The RER B is the most common means of public transport connecting CDG Airport to the heart of Paris, crossing the city center (serving Gare du Nord and Châtelet, among others).

The journey time is approximately **25 minutes** to/from Gare du Nord and **40 minutes** to/from Châtelet, with trains running **every 10 to 20 minutes** on weekdays.

- Tickets cost **€14 each**.

FROM/TO ORLY AIRPORT



TAXIS

The taxi ride between Paris-Orly and central Paris usually takes **between 25 and 45 minutes**, depending on traffic conditions. Taxis leaving from the airport charge flat rates: **€36 to Paris Rive Gauche and €45 to Paris Rive Droite**.



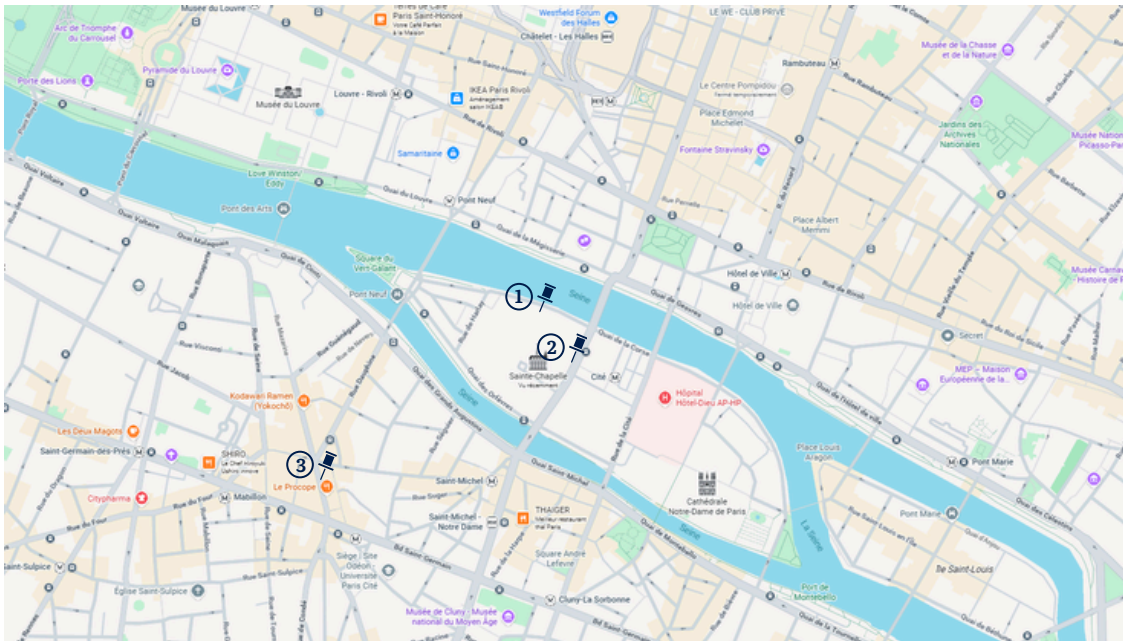
METRO LINE 14

Metro line 14 connects Paris-Orly Airport (Terminal 3 station) to central Paris, offering the fastest means of transport, **approximately 25-26 minutes to Châtelet**.




The journey requires the purchase of a “Ticket Paris Région <=> Aéroports” (**single ticket for €14**). The metro runs every day from 5:30 a.m. to midnight, with a high frequency of **2 to 5 minutes** on average.

The combination of the RER B and OrlyVal lines (connecting at Antony station) also links the capital to Paris-Orly Airport.
